X. Open Forum – Discussion Item

Time for members of the audience to address the Commission.

Quiller shared an updated club points sheet and announced LSBA is in 1st place with 4,920 points, Pre-Law is in 2nd place with 2,330 points, and Pre-OT is in 3rd place with 2,275 points. She noted the last day to submit club points will be on May 28. She also mentioned the Organizations Commission will have their last two meetings on May 14 and June 11; she stated they will be having their EOY celebration June 11. Quiller noted the general budget has an ending balance of \$3,722. Quiller reminded clubs and orgs to submit their winner's forms so students can receive their prizes/incentives. She also mentioned for clubs and orgs to remind students to be consistent with their emails to access information to retrieve their prize.

White reminded that Orgs submit in their PPR forms by next week to get their funding request to be approved next meeting. Romeo shared the elections code document and requested for The Commission to give feedback on any necessary changes. Romero explained the Elections Commission plans to remove required signatures for Candidate applications to fit an online format. Romero inquired about ideas or feedback on candidate requirements for the application. A commission member asked why they were removing the required signatures area and White explained less candidates were applying for Board of Directors positions because it was hard attaining signatures. White suggested for the signatures to be decreased to 25 and require two letters of recommendation. Romero shared her email so commission members can send suggested changes.
