- III. Approval of Agenda – Action Item

- IV. Approval of Minutes (October 30, 2020) – Action Item
*M/M.E.Ch.A, S/History Club to approve the minutes of October 30, 2020 as submitted **VOTE: UNANIMOUS**
- V. Time Certain 12:50 PM Alice Gordon, Deputy Director for Food on Foot.
Gordon explained the purpose behind Food on Foot, a nonprofit organization dedicated to assist homelessness and low-income individuals across Los Angeles county. Gordon noted that Food on Foot gives individuals a fresh start through life-skills education programs, full-time employment, and permanent housing. Gordon also mentioned the requirements and

steps the individuals must go through to finish the programs. She hopes members from The Committee can get involved and help through the internship program, *Youth on Foot*. Shanice Wells, Youth on Foot Intern, noted the program is currently doing a holiday campaign to raise \$10,000 during the month of November to support Hunger and Homeless Awareness Week. Gordon encouraged the clubs/orgs to get involved in drives and social fundraisers hosted by Food on Foot. She provided contact information along with the Food on Foot website: www.foodonfoot.org. M.E.Ch.A inquired if there would be job opportunities in due time and Gordon noted Job opportunities vary within departments. CDA asked about facilitating a clothing drive, Gordon reiterated that the program is currently holding a care package drive. However, if there is interest in running a clothing drive, clubs and orgs can donate to Food On Foot, but must ensure the clothing is washed and include reasonable clothing sizes.

VI. Open Forum – Agenda Items Only

Time for members of the audience to address the Commission on specific agenda items only. White announced that the next Orgs Commission meeting will not be until December 11. Therefore, they wanted to allow CDA a chance to request funds for their event next week. White reminded The Committee to submit their PPR forms in advanced, preferably on Mondays by noon. Norrbom stated that every event under New Business has been approved on Toro Link. Quiller urged all clubs and orgs to advertise ASI as their sponsor when making their flyers because the majority forgot to do so in this meeting.

VII. Unfinished Business

Advisor's Advice Corner – Discussion Item

The Commission will review and discuss an overview of the ASI Organizations Commission. Quiller provided a budget recap to update The Commission on their ending balance. Quiller noted the overall ending balance for the Org Commission's general budget is \$5,907.05. She also mentioned that the remaining balance for Orgs Promo/startup funds budget is \$700 while Student Activities is \$4,125.

VIII. New Business

A. History Club Funding Request – Discussion/Action Item

The Commission will discuss and consider funding History Club's Game Night event. History Club requested \$60 for a \$25, \$20, and \$15 gifts cards that will be given 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place game night winners. The goal of the event is to allow students a chance to distress after midterm week. The Game Night event will be open to all students who want to play Among us on 11/19 at 7:00 PM.

B. EOPSA Student Association Funding Request – Discussion /Action Item

The Commission will discuss and consider funding EOPSA's Game Night event. EOPSA is requesting \$150 for ten \$15 Amazon gift cards to award individuals at Game Night. EOPSA noted this is a social event where students can create a community while playing Among us. EOPSA will host their event to all students on 11/20 from 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM.

C. EOP Student Association Funding Request – Discussion /Action Item

The Commission will discuss and consider funding EOPSA’s promotional Item.

EOPSA requested \$50 to purchase twelve club t-shirts to help increase their community and closeness during the virtual academic year. Since their total cost value is \$282, EOPSA reported finding an outer source to provide funds to pay it off. Quiller reminded The Committee they can request up to \$50 in funds if the promotional item does not advertise the ASI logo.

D. Hermandad de Sigma Iota Alpha, Inc. Funding Request – Discussion/Action Item

The Commission will discuss and consider funding Hermandad de Sigma Iota Alpha’s Loteria Night event.

Hermandad de Sigma Iota Alpha, Inc requested \$45 for three \$15 Amazon gifts cards that will be given to students who win Loteria Night event. The goal is to be recognized by students while having a bonding experience through a fun game. They hope all students can join their Loteria Night Event taking place on 11/13 at 5:00 PM. A member from The Committee asked if there would be a fee to play and Hermandad de Sigma Iota clarified there was not, as charging violates the PPR Guidelines.

E. Child Development Association Funding Request – Discussion/Action Item

The Commission will discuss and consider funding Child Development Association Scavenger Hunt.

Child Development Association requested \$30 for three \$10 Starbucks gifts cards that will be rewarded to winners of the Scavenger Hunt. Students will hunt for items at home and will be declared winners when they find the items first. The event will open to all students on 11/18 at 4:00 PM. CDA noted students can use this virtual event to eat and socialize with other members of the club. Norrbom chimed in and reminded CDA that gift cards must be awarded to members and non-members.

IX. Reports

University Rep: Norrbom announced OSU will be hosting ‘Specialty Forms Friday’ for any student orgs that still have outstanding forms today from 2:00 PM – 3:00 PM. Norrbom also urged for students who need a laptop or are facing laptop issues to check a new one out through the CSUDH Technology Loan Program. (Resource website: <https://techloaner.csudh.edu/index.php?logout=1>) Since next week is National Hunger and Homeless Awareness week, CSUDH Basic Needs Initiative is hosting events between 11/12 and 11/20. Norrbom suggested visiting the Basic Needs website or Instagram page if anyone needs information on the events or wants to donate. Norrbom announced that Toro Dreamers Success Center is offering a scholarship for eligible AB-540 or DACA Students. She noted

the scholarship ranges from \$500 - \$1000 and students can apply through MyCSUDH portal by 11/16. Norrbom also encouraged everyone to remain safe during the Holiday season.

Korean Culture Club mentioned they were hosting a Dance Competition event tonight from 5:30 PM – 7:00 PM. The three top 3 winners will win a gift card after performing a 45 second to 1-minute dance routine. Korean Culture Club suggested checking for event info on ToroLink or their Instagram page for anyone intrigued to join.

Elections Commissioner Romero announced ASI is accepting applications from students who want to join Student Elections and become an ASI Board of Director member for the 2021-2022 academic year. (Application link:

X. Open Forum – Discussion Item

Time for members of the audience to address the Commission.

Quiller briefly explained the gift card process to clarify any remaining confusion. She noted gift cards take at least 10 business days to be ready for winners to use. Quiller also mentioned clubs and orgs should notify her when they had their event, list their attendees/ winners, and gift card amounts so she can forward a winner's form. Quiller urged anyone who has questions or needs further guidance to contact her. Norrbom inquired the process Clubs/orgs need to follow when requesting funds for food delivery programs instead of gift cards. Quiller noted that ASI has a corporate account with Grub Hub Holdings and encouraged clubs to request funds if they are interested in having a virtual meal together. CDA inquired where to locate the ASI logo to place on flyers and Quiller stated it could be found on the ASI website. (Resource link: <http://asicsudh.com/branding/>) A member from the Committee asked if they need to fill out paperwork if they want to partner with Food on Foot and Norrbom clarified they should work directly with Food on Foot. Quiller mentioned there is funding for those interested in childcare support and urged anyone to contact her for more information. She also encouraged members to participate in the next town hall panel event with CSUDH faculty; to voice student concerns, issues or inquiries to Administration.
