A. Finance Student Society Funding Request – Discussion/Action Item
The Commission will Discuss and consider funding for Finance Student Society Funding Request.
A representative from the Finance Society stated that this is their first year back on campus since COVID-19. They are requesting a sum of \$500 to host a Wall Street Prep Bootcamp that is open to all majors. The bootcamp will focus on financial remodeling and will run for 2 days from 9 AM to 5 PM. All expenses

The main aim of this event is to help students gain a better understanding of finances and how to maintain their finances post-college.

IX. Pickle Ball Club Funding Request – Discussion/Action Item

The commission will discuss and consider funding for Pickle Ball club Startup Funds. A representative asked for \$60, but only \$50 was available. The funds will be used for startup expenses such as first aid and sunscreen, as well as for any necessary repairs since the activities are held outdoors. Their goal is to establish pickleball courts on campus. Currently, they play at Steven Park on Mondays from 5 PM to 9 PM until they secure a location on campus. The school has approved their request, but they only have three tennis courts which can be converted into eight pickleball courts. They received donations of balls, nets, and paddles from the Kinesiology Department. The club representative will contact Vorobiev to try to expedite the process. Vorobiev inquired about the possibility of renting a court at Dignity Health and obtaining pricing information for the semester.
