Tuesday for student presentation. They believe these issues reflect DH students' concerns. Shakoor inquired about the committee's next steps, leading her to request that each member research one proposition, including its purpose and supporters. She will compile the findings into slides. Mejia-Alezano noted that many articles are available on these propositions, and Gayle provided a document outlining support and opposition, which she will share. Grave assigned each board member a proposition to review.

Alvarez proposed researching two propositions each for a balanced perspective. The ballot breakdown is set for October 7, 3:30 PM - 4:30 PM in room 325, with a presentation, voting guide, QR code for registration, and a sticker sheet. Shakoor suggested inviting Mims or the League of Women Voters for assistance. To boost student attendance, they could email clubs, offer points as an incentive, and gather interest from peers in their colleges. Grave and Truong also considered presenting voter registration and ballot bowl information in their classes.
