VIII. New Business

A. Digital Media Arts Club Request – Discussion/Action Item

The Commission will discuss and consider the Digital Media Arts Club's funding request.

They are requesting funding, \$205.77, to buy snacks for the screening of Inside the Kiln, a psychological thriller filmed at CSUDH with the biggest budget raised by students. This screening will be on October 22nd at the Lacorte Hall starting at 5:30 p.m. All students are welcome. The snacks they want to purchase are sodas, popcorn, and an opportunity drawing to draw a gift card, and to buy a poster that their designer designed for the event. Patino suggested rounding up the funding request to \$230 to include taxes.

B. Indian Student Organizations Request – Discussion/Action Item

The Commission will discuss and consider the Indian Student Organization's funding request.

The Indian Student Organization is requesting funding, \$500 for gift cards and décor for their Diwali Festival event. This event welcomes all students and will take place on October 22nd from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. in the LSU Palm Courtyard. Diwali Festival is a cultural event meant to spread light, joy, and festive cheer. The gift cards would be awarded to the best ethnic wear and would be voted for by the students.

C. Public Health Toro Association Request

The Commission will review PHTA's funding request and upcoming events.

Public Health Toro Association is requesting funding, \$342.76, to purchase art supplies and food for their Brush and Bond social mixer. All students are invited, and the art supplies include tripods, canvases, paintbrushes, and paint. The food that would be provided is from Subway. This event would be on October 23rd in Palm

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Courtyard from 12:00 – 4:00 p.m. They have a limited capacity of 40 people, so an RSVP is required.

PHTA notes that they are over the budget of \$500 by \$5; they will supplement the rest with their own money, and the approved amount will not include this amount that is over budget. The Commission asked them that, because the event is next week, what they will do if the items don't arrive on time. Patino states that they should send her a list of the items they want to order today to ensure they arrive on time, since ASI has an Amazon Prime account.

IX. Open Forum – Discussion Item

Time for members of the audience to address the Commission.

Ordonez invited 5 clubs to be part of the Halloween Hunt on October 25th in the LSU Ballroom C to promote their club. Our Events Coordinator would decide which clubs go to the Halloween Hunt, and meal vouchers would be provided to the clubs that are accepted to participate. Halloween Haunt has two pending sponsorships, and the activities planned are caricatures, face paint, tarot reading, a photo booth, and a candy bar. The Commissioner reminds clubs/organizations that Student Activities funding requests are recommended for requests of \$500 or more. The total budget for Student Activities is \$6000 for the whole academic year, and the commission meetings are on an “as-needed basis”. Patino states that this year, the Organizations Commission has a separate budget for registration fees; there is no limit to what you can request, and the total budget set aside for registration fees is \$2600. Although there is no cap to what can be requested for registration fees, keep in mind the full amount may not be approved by the commission, as these funds are supposed to be for all clubs and last all academic year. It is up to the clubs in the Organizations Commission to decide what amount will be awarded to clubs. The Commission explained that the registration budget is for workshops and conferences. Clubs asked if the Commission has an idea of how much money is left from the Organization Committee budget. Patino will update them on how much of the budget is

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left in the next Organization meeting to help clubs make an informed decision when voting to approve funding requests from clubs/organizations. The Commission clarified that once the \$500 event funding from the Organizations Committee is reached, then they would have to go to Student Activities for any other requests. The Commission also clarified that if any club wants to request funding for a summer event, they will have to request those funds before the final meeting of the year in April. Patino states that funding requests are done with the PPR form, and everything must be included for clubs to be added to the agenda. PPR must be done 6 weeks before the event date. For a club PPR to be on the agenda, they must send it to the Organizations Commissioner by the Friday before the Organization Meeting.

Anime Club will host a Halloween Maid Café event on October 30th, and they are asking for volunteers to help them out. and reminded people interested in attending should rsvp via Torolink.

Public Health Toro Association states that Designed to Lead has grants to help clubs out since they believe in developing leaders for tomorrow's challenges. PHTA also announced that they have a Panda fundraiser on October 14th, from 9:30 to 7:00 p.m.

Male Success Alliance will have its first event for Dia de los Muertos on October 23rd. They are hoping to present their funding request at the next meeting.

Ordonez is trying to revive Toro Psych Club and has invited everyone to participate in their meetings.

Dungeons & Dragons invited everyone to their meeting today at 2:30 p.m.
